For safety reasons, nearly all senior apartment complexes have some kind of security. Numerous communities have keyed entries, are gated, and could even have security personnel on hand. Other security features might consist of security cameras, and well-lit parking areas and sidewalks. Ideally, the building must have front desk staff or the interior of the building must not be able to be accessed without using an intercom system.

Deciding to move from a home that they can own to a home that they must pay rent for is one major adjustment that lots of seniors should face. Then again, freeing up the equity from one's home can allow seniors much more freedom to do some of the things which they may not have had money and time for previously.
